

## Light the World PRI

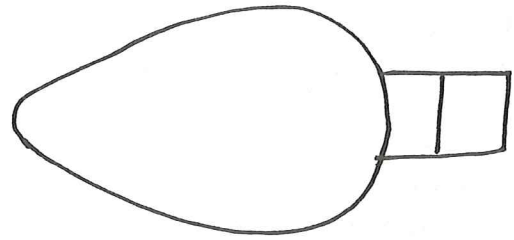
God sent his Son to be the light for the world.

### **You will need:**

Globe  
Color construction paper  
Tape  
Scissors

### **To do:**

Cut Christmas light bulb shapes from the colored construction paper. Place in a basket near the globe. Encourage the children during Advent to look for kind actions taking place around them. Each time a kind act is noticed, ask a child to print the name of the person performing the kind act onto a construction paper light bulb. Tape the bulb to the globe and talk about how we can light up the world with kind acts.



## Lighthouse ALL

Jesus lights our way.

Make a lighthouse and discuss how Jesus lights the way for us in life. Fill the lighthouse with ways the family can grow closer in faith.

### **You will need:**

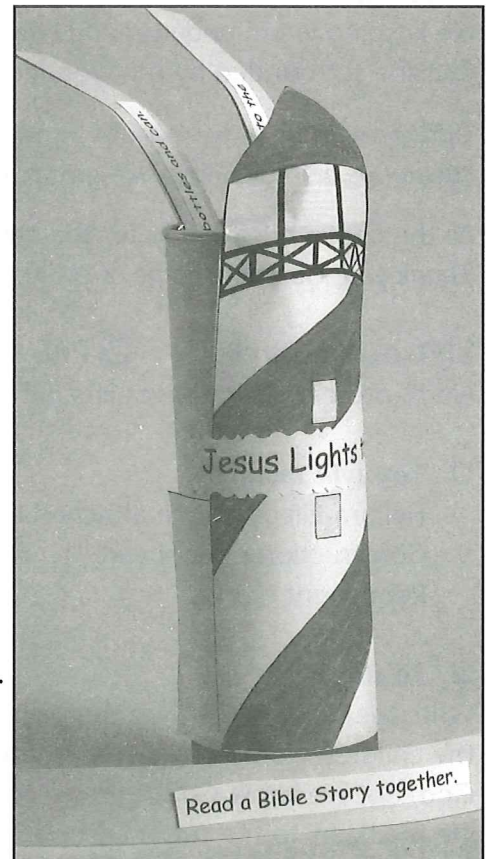
Pringles® can  
Tape  
Markers  
Enlarged and printed lighthouse copy  
Yellow paper

### **To do:**

Have the children cut out the lighthouse and color it. Next tape it around the Pringles can. On yellow paper strips, print out the following suggestions for families. Inviting them to take one idea a week from the lighthouse and work on it together.

Read a Bible story together right after supper or at bedtime.  
Take a walk and talk about the wonder of God's creation.  
Begin recycling something you have not yet started to recycle.  
Clean out your closets and drawers and take a trip to the Goodwill.

Bake cookies together and give some of them away.



☐ **More to do:**

Wrap and tape a smaller copy of the lighthouse to a flashlight.

Sing, "this Little Light of Mine," or the following song to the tune of, "I'm a Little Teapot."
